Qualifications and Training

The *Safety Management System Requirements for Adventure Activity Operators* requires providers to ensure staff have the required competence for their assigned tasks (or are supervised by someone with the required competence), and have their competence verified through assessment and revalidation.



Nationally recognised qualifications should be used where relevant. In the absence of such qualifications, providers need to show that staff competence has been verified by an expert and that they're maintaining currency with good practice.

Qualifications bring better assurance that activities are being provided in a way that is consistent with good practice. They best meet the legal requirement to use trained staff, and make it easier for auditors to recommend certification.

The following agencies provide information on qualifications and training. Numerous private companies also provide training, and sometimes qualifications.
